Description of Past Work

What They Didn't Teach Us: The Sex Education Theatre Project, 2019

For many LGBT2SIA+ youth, the current school system focuses on mainstream heteronormative sexual education, and therefore, many of the youth end up learning from each other; leaving information gaps on things that are specific to LGBT2SIA+ individuals.

A progressive and inclusive sexual education, along with the potential for Gay-Straight Alliances to be banned in certain school boards, was at risk in the provincial Alberta election of 2019. This immersive theatre performance saw LGBT2SIA+ youth & their allies working together to propose the questions and answers that youth really have about sex, gender and orientation — Teens teaching adults sex education.

Crescent Heights Village Days, 2018-present

In collaboration with Crescent Heights Community Association, the Crescent Heights Community VILLAGE DAYS (June 1- July 1) celebrates the people and places in the Calgary inner-city community of Crescent Heights. The month-long festival encourages residents to build community connections and to develop the cultural identity of this diverse neighbourhood. www.villagedays.ca

Events, gatherings, activities and creative projects are all organized by residents, businesses, and organizations based in Crescent Heights, Calgary.

As a resident and embedded artist in this neighbourhood, I was tasked with developing the engagement of this neighbourhood over the course of 2 years and tackling safety, connection, and isolation through multiple arts and cultural development initiatives. This festival is one of these examples.

Kitchen Table Project, 2019

In collaboration with Crescent Heights Community Association and low-income residents of the community. Crescent Heights is a neighbourhood in inner-city Calgary, Alberta, Canada. Although considered to be an affluent neighbourhood, it also is also home to many residents who are barely getting by financially and are, for whatever reason, on the brink, currently in or may have lived experience with poverty. Poverty can affect anyone and look like anyone. Often times, we are so busy trying to keep all the balls up the air that we forget that we need to community and nourishment.

Residents with lived experience with poverty designed and built a kitchen table and hosted a potluck for the community. The table features moments in their lives when they had abundant community and when they have had very little community. The kitchen table is the site of connecting with neighbours and sharing a meal with dignity -- together. Across all income levels featured in the community of Crescent Heights.

Procession for the End of Time, 2019

In collaboration between myself and site-specific dancer, Melanie Kloetzal, this project, under the ad hoc group TRAction Art Group, engaged citizens of Calgary who are concerned with climate change and performed a procession down Stephen Avenue in Calgary. The procession consisted of funeral-going individuals in gas masks and carrying a dead tree while tolling bells.

#SAFEAB Campaign, 2015

Working with youth from Forest Lawn High School Gay-Straight Alliance, I facilitated the brainstorming, writing, development and filming to create a project completely conceived by them to address the public on the benefits of every school in Alberta having a Gay-Straight Alliance if the students so wish to start one. This was created in response to the controversial Bill 202 in Alberta politics.

Forest Lawn Natural Playground & Park, 2015

Coordinated community consultation to inquire about how a specific green space located in Forest Lawn could become a hub for community activity. Information was collected and a new natural playground was constructed including permanently installed art work created by youth in the community.

Success in Education Animations, 2015

Working with a series of partners and newly immigrated youth from different parts of Calgary, we facilitated skill sharing in stop-frame animation and creative writing. The youth then created their own animations detailing the supports and barriers associated with having a successful education as an newly immigrated youth. The animations were compiled and presented to the school board trustees, administrators and teachers in the Calgary Board of Education.

Fire, 2015

Presented at Nuit Blanche: Kelowna, 2015, this work dealt with the delicate role that wild fires play in the ecology and lifecycle of the lodge pole pine (which needs heat to populate) contrasted with humanities relationship with wild fires and our actions of heating up the atmosphere. The work was installed in a public place, just outside Fire Hall #2 in downtown Kelowna, and included a vide, material installation comprised of burnt wood and lodgepole pines from the West Kelowna forest first of 2015, and engaged the ordinary citizen of Kelowna (who is familiar with wild fires) in a dialogue about these delicate relationships.

Hold Up The Tree, 2015

Presented at the David Suzuki Foundation's Blue Dot Movement: Kelowna Movement, 2015. This work asked people attending the presentation at the Kelowna Community Theatre to hold up a log as a physical commitment to supporting the environment. This metaphorical action of supporting the environment not only generated discussion around this metaphor but also created a sense of community as the interchanging individuals who jumped into take over someone else's side of holding the log also created a sense of community while tasked with holding up this log.

Being Together, 2015

Presented at Mile Zero Dance Artist-in-Residency in Edmonton, 2013. This work grew out of research to understand the collective mind of a relationship, a group of people, a city, a nation or the world. Perceiving a world where there are no hierarchies or leaders and in which we organically transcend collectivism. Taking the notions of devised collective theatre into the realm of the city as a stage. Four performers researched their surroundings, the people they encounter, their conversations with each other and the paths that got them to and from the venue in order to examine this idea of collective movement.

Watching People Being Together, 2014

Presented at Seities Art Gallery in Calgary, Alberta. Calling into question how we relate to everyone and everything around us, including our family, our community, our city, our nation and our world, I embarked on a form of performance and sustainability methodology research after working with Portuguese choreographer/performance researcher, Joao Fiadiero in the Summer of 2013. We explore ways in which community or groups of people can work and be together without the need for an established hierarchy of power. This research would later culminate in a performance created at the Mile Zero Dance Artist-in-Residency in 2015.

Mating Calls, 2013

Presented at Q the Arts, 2013; ARTSCO 60x60, 2013. Mating Calls is a performance piece that teases out and attempts to map the diverse and fluid ways in which the animal kingdom procreates. This is the sex education class you wish you had back in junior high! Each performance is unique in that it uses the audience from the location in which the performance is presented to explore and further diversify the unique nature of attraction and mating amongst humanity. Mating Calls addresses issues of sexual expression, diversity, politics, and education in a fun, approachable, and thought-provoking manner.

XY*, 2012, 2013, 2015

Presented at Alternator Art Gallery, 2012; Q the Arts, 2013; Theatre Junction GRAND Mezzanine, 2015. XY* is the new male. Taking a critical view on the male-identifying subject and the social, political and cultural notions surrounding what it means to be a male. In my work I seek to reclaim and unite a new masculinity in an era where such terms as bromance and no homo are used; where homosexual male characters are presented in mainstream media and a 'straight' male can consider a 'gay' male his best friend. Over a period of three years I collected ejaculation patterns from different men. Each of the men have varying sexual orientations (Straight, Bisexual, Gay) however all of the subjects identified as being a man. The collection continues to grow as I attempt to create an archive of the ever evolving and more accepting male; the sameness and the differences amongst all the individuals you see in this collection.
